ABOUT THE ORGANIZATION

Offering much more than cookies, camping, and crafts, Girl Scouting today gives girls access to the resources they need to become effective leaders and valuable contributors to their communities. Reflecting the changing needs of our society, a priority for Girl Scouts today is the promotion of leadership and educational opportunities for all girls through four key focus areas: increased involvement in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM), environmental stewardship, and outdoor activities, strengthening financial literacy and entrepreneurial skills, and promoting safe and healthy living.

To support these priorities, Girl Scouts of Northern California (GSNorCal) provides an array of educational opportunities through traditional pathways such as summer camps and K-12 troops, together with community based programs that bring Girl Scouting to communities where volunteer-led troops may not be available. GSNorCal's staff-led programs help fill gaps in the educational, developmental, and social needs of almost 3,000 low-income, high-need girls each year.
